Knight Commission's Legacy of Success Aligning Incentives with Educational Values

Academic threshold for postseason eligibility.

In 2011, NCAA adopted a long-time Knight Commission recommendation that requires teams to be on track to graduate at least 50% of players to compete in postseason.

• Academic incentives embedded in the College Football Playoff and NCAA revenue distributions.



A Pivotal Period in College Sports



A Pivotal Period of College Sports

- 1. NCAA v. Alston Supreme Court 9-0 ruling against NCAA in (not about NIL)
- 2. Name, Image & Likeness Historic Change in (NIL) policies; *implemented* with no guardrails/enforcement or uniformity, coupled with transfer freedom
- **3. FBS football finances** reshaping the entire landscape through conference realignments, media rights deals, CFP expansion
- **4. Holistic Student-Athlete Model** and Transformation Committee recommendations approved by DI Board
- **5. Potential Externally Forced Changes to Model**: Athletes classified as employees; NIL damages litigation; state legislative activities, including revenue sharing



Lucrative and High-Profile College Sports Events



Managed by NCAA

Distributes more than **\$600m annually** to more than **350** DI schools;

Other March Madness revenues (nearly \$400m) fund all national services including FBS Football and 90 national championships for all 3 divisions




Managed independently by Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Conferences

Distributes nearly **\$600m annually** to more than **130** FBS schools

CFP funds <u>NONE</u> of NCAA national operations costs for FBS Football; **Expansion may take revenues to \$2 BILLION annually**






Projected 2027 Revenue Distribution




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


Projected Crossover Point Comparison SEC vs ACC Public Institutions - 2023-2032



Data represent 13 public schools from 2015-2024 and 15 public schools starting in 2025, with an average of 20 sports.





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

Financial Accountability within Current Governance

Option 2

Align CFP revenues with football national expenses

CFP revenues would fund all national FBS football expenses (e.g., enforcement, legal services, insurance) currently covered by the NCAA.

An estimated \$60M*

Alignment

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF



Align revenue distribution with championships structure

Count only NCAA championship sports in NCAA Revenue Distribution formula, excluding FBS Football since the CFP is not an NCAA championship.

An estimated \$61-66M

Change NCAA incentives to align with existing NCAA Constitutional Principles:

Incentivize Existing NCAA Principles through Shared Revenue Distributions

Gender Equity

Incentives

Require that any financial distributions based on athletics success provide **equal rewards for performance** of women's and men's teams

Racial Equity

Create a new Racial Equity Standard as a filter to achieve academic units utilizing a maximum percentage gap between Black and White college athlete Graduation Success Rates

Sports Sponsorship

Create a new reward to incentivize athlete opportunities and provide significantly more money for schools with more than 17 sports







Final Takeaways – College Sports is Changing

- CFP revenue will increase \$1.4 Billion and Power 5 media rights continue to see exponential growth
- Projections show if change does not happen now, "crossover" will
- A financial plan is needed and is possible now that:
 - Aligns structure with governance
 - Incentivizes existing principles, and
 - Focuses the use of money on the education, health, safety, equity, and well-being of college athletes

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


Alternative Growth Rate Projections



Compound Growth Rate for FY15 - FY19


Growth in Coaching Compensation Compared to Athlete Scholarships and Medical Expenses (millions)






Compound Growth Rate for FY11 – FY22


